



EARTHCARE CORNER - By MeiLing Albert



I want to take this opportunity to explain why we compost part of our garbage in California.

This mandate went into effect January 1, 2022, although it was part of a bill introduced in 2016. The goal has been the 75% reduction of organic waste disposal and 20% increase in edible food recovery by 2025. Behold! It is 2025! I wonder how close the state has come to meeting those goals? I hope most people are composting in their green bins at home. Update: 90% of edible foods are now being recycled to food stations for the hungry.

For organic waste collection, areas that have residential organics collection (compost) report 92% collection, 23% with rural and low population waivers report organic collections. In the past, 40% of food produced in California went uneaten. Six million tons of food went into landfills.

Some people may consider this government over reach. Before the composting law went into effect, 56% (over half) of landfill content was food waste, food, soiled paper, and green waste. As organic waste decomposes, methane gas is released that is 84 times more potent than carbon dioxide (CO2). That IS significant.

Besides fruit and veggie scraps and meats, foods that are compostable are: coffee grounds & filters; tea bags; egg shells; bones; food-soiled napkins & paper towels; non-coated paper plates; paper cups with no plastic coating or liquid; wooden chopsticks; pizza boxes. Green waste is yard waste: branches, logs, leaves, grass—no pebbles or rocks, sand, dirt, or ashes. In my area, no black walnut shells.

When food waste, green waste and other organic waste are separated from the rest of the landfill, it can be transformed into low carbon fuel and compost for farms in Solano and Yolo counties. Recology Vacaville does just that. Methane gas is channeled into pipes that carry it to a place where it is transformed into usable energy. The compost is sold to farms. Edible foods that are recovered from food markets and schools and farms are used to feed hungry people, of which there are many. And the number may be growing.
